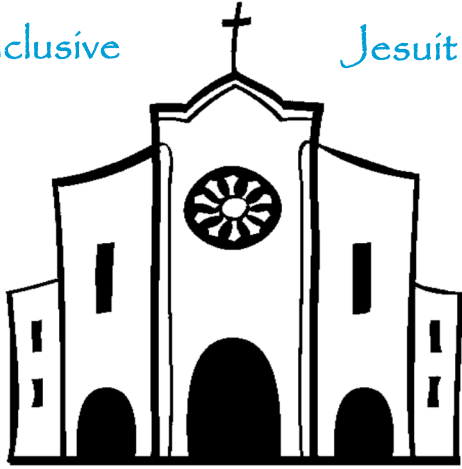

Dear Parishioners,

Of late, I have been reflecting upon the importance of being a person who seeks and speaks the truth. This means being a person of integrity and authenticity. Recently, I have been moved by the death of a classmate, Ferg Flanagan, who was always humble and truthful, a person of extraordinary talent who always pursued the path of truth.

The great Trappist Thomas Merton believed that the only true path to happiness is prayer and prayer begins with self-discovery. The search requires honest self-love. He thought that to live the truth of our existence is to be a saint, that God's truth is within and can be reached through the path of self-discovery. To be honest with ourselves, to be self-reflective, to honor what is true, will lead us to the god within and to unity with God.

We live in a world where we do not always experience truth. Unfortunately, we can be so inundated by what is not true, by lies, that we grow to accept them as not evil. We all know what lies can do to a relationship. The psychologist Maria Konnikova is very concerned how the brain deals with a stream of lies, whether from a person close to us or a person in authority. Our brains, she says, are ill equipped to deal with lies when they come not singly but in a constant stream. Our brain can be so overwhelmed with false statements that we stop trying to sift through everything. It's called "cognitive overload". Eventually, without quite realizing it, our brains just give up trying to figure out what is true. We can lose our sensitivity and desire to know the truth and live the truth. We accept lies as basic facts.

My sisters and brothers, if we too can discover God within, our interior life must be committed to the truth. Otherwise, we become "*People of the Lie*".
