Dear Parishioners,

The flu and cold epidemic has been in our daily consciousness the past few months because we all know people who have been stricken by it and may still be slowly recovering from it. In an effort to heighten people's awareness on minimizing the spread of the flu and staying healthy, the Archdiocese of San Francisco has issued a memorandum to parishes with some recommendations.

The Chancery regularly monitors the recommendations of the Centers for Disease Control, the California Department of Public Health, the San Francisco Department of Public Health, the San Mateo County Public Health Department, and the Marin Health & Human Services. Currently, all have the flu as an "Advisory" (providing information but not calling for action) but not yet an "Alert" (warranting immediate attention). Should the status change to an Alert or a call to cease contact, they will reevaluate and inform the parishes of any necessary additional action.

Here are highlights taken from the memorandum:

- This is an opportunity to teach and practice the use of common sense in sharing the sign of peace and the chalice.
- The obligation to attend Sunday Mass does not apply to those who are ill, especially those who suffer from contagious disease. It is a sign of consideration for others that those with flu-like symptoms remain at home.
- For the convenience of those who are homebound, or unable to attend Mass because of illness or infirmity, Mass is broadcast each Sunday morning at 6:00 am on Channel 8, 20 (Comcast), KTSF 26 as well as on EWTN.
- The following ministers should excuse themselves from serving at Mass if they feel any hint of a cold or flu: Deacons, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, Lectors, Musicians, Hospitality ministers, Altar Servers, etc.
- We also ask those who are not well [or still recovering] to refrain from offering your hand to others at the sign of peace. No one who fears infection should feel obligated to share the sign of peace or receive Holy Communion from the communal chalice.

We pray for the health and recovery of all who are ill and are unable to be with us today.
