Dear Parishioners,

Palm Sunday is the beginning of the most sacred week in the Church calendar. This weekend we enter into the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Our Saviour. There are so many emotions to this week from the sorrow at Jesus' suffering to the joy of the Resurrection. It is important to keep our eyes on Jesus, to be with him as he enters into his sufferings and to desire to experience his joy at being raised from the dead.

Ignatius of Loyola gives us some helpful suggestions for our prayer during this week. Ignatius says that you should realize that Jesus is suffering his passion for you, that he embraces his cross out of love for you. He also wants you to not focus on Jesus' divinity during his passion but on his humanity. It is almost like Jesus is hiding his divinity. When we come to the Resurrection he wants you to see Jesus' role as a consoler to his disciples and friends. And here it seems that Jesus' humanity is hiding itself. All you can see is his divinity. You do not want to experience your joy at Jesus' Resurrection but his joy. Jesus' joy will lead to your joy. The primary referent is always Jesus. May your journey this week lead you to a more intimate relationship with Jesus.

I want to inform you that in May I will have a Laminectomy - surgery performed to alleviate pain from spinal stenosis. It will be done at UCSF and it lasts about one hour. I will then recover at Sacred Heart Jesuit Center during May. The doctor says I will feel like a new person. So be ready to see me skipping down the aisle at the beginning of Mass.
