Dear Parishioners,

One of the more intriguing figures in the gospels is John's "the disciple whom Jesus loved". This figure puts his head on Jesus' breast at the Last Supper. He is the one who runs with Peter to the tomb after Mary of Magdala tells them of the missing body, He is the one who stands at the cross of Jesus with Mary his mother and hears the words "Woman, behold your son; Son, behold your mother." Who is this disciple whom Jesus loved"? Many biblical scholars say it is "YOU".

When Peter and the disciple run to the tomb, he allows Peter to go in first. Peter is baffled by the missing body but the disciple, we are told, believed immediately when he enters the tomb. He believed because he had been touched by Jesus' love. He believed because once he was loved by Jesus and loved in return he had entered into the realm of the heart. "God is Love" and when we experience true sacrificial love we enter into the meaning of God in Jesus.

My sisters and brothers, if you want to believe in Jesus try loving. Loving selflessly will make Jesus realistic. When our nation and world learn to love, then we will become believers. When we stop turning our back away from the refugee, the poor, the homeless, the person different from us, then we will receive Jesus. What a tragedy to reject love and Jesus.

## Easter Season Flowers through Pentecost


