Dear Parishioners,

We have been hearing a great deal about St. Paul in the Easter Season readings. What is so striking is that he was a person who experienced great joy but also significant persecution. He no doubt had a great love for the community at Philippi: "I thank my God for you every time I think of you." Yet, elsewhere he met such resistance because of his inclusive message of Christianity. Finally, beyond his imprisonments he died a martyr's death.

There is a great lesson in Paul's life. Whether we like it or not, Life is a journey that presents both joy and suffering. No one escapes this. Ignatius of Loyola says when you are in consolation remember that struggles will come and when you are in desolation recall those past moments of joy. Life is a balancing act. Stay open and free.

What significantly helped Paul was that his being was rooted in the Holy Spirit. When times were difficult, he knew the Spirit was with him AND HE LISTENED TO THE HOLY SPIRIT! When times were consoling, HE LISTENED TO THE HOLY SPIRIT.

Pentecost is next Sunday when we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit. May you listen carefully and discern this voice that brings joy, peace, compassion and mercy.

This is Fr. Kevin O'Brien, S.J.'s last weekend at St. Agnes as he prepares to take on the mantle of the presidency of Santa Clara University. How blessed we have been to have this wonderful Jesuit with us the past few years. Fr. Kevin, you are always welcome. Come back to us whenever you like.

New Directions in Sanctuary: Standing with St. Anthony's and St. Peter's Churches

Sunday, June 23, 2pm @

St. Anthony's Church (3215 Cesar Chavez St.)

St. Agnes is currently discerning how to continue to live out its commitment to Sanctuary. In the midst of this discernment has come a call to partner with sister parishes in our city that are most directly affected by immigration and housing crises.

Immigrant leaders from St. Anthony's and St. Peter's Catholic Churches in the Mission are asking parishioners from St. Agnes and St. Ignatius to stand in solidarity with them as they call for dignified housing for the elderly. Several years ago, these leaders successfully advocated for the City to build affordable housing for seniors at 1296 Shotwell Street, but they recently discovered that the lowest rent in this new "affordable" building will be \$1100 a month. For the many seniors on social security making \$600-800 a month, this rent exceeds their entire monthly income. The St. Anthony's and St. Peter's leaders are asking the City to provide additional subsidies to make these apartments truly affordable. Contact Grace@SaintAgnesSF.com for more information.
